

He edited Rabbits magazine and was department editor of Countryside magazine. He was an ARBA director and advertising and publicity chairman. He showed rabbits for over 50 years and won BOB Tan at an ARBA convention. Born in New York City, he lives in Vermont.



Dr. Scott Williamson, is a Professor of Animal Science at California State University, Fresno. Dr. Williamson earned a B.S. in Animal Science from Purdue University, and went on to gain a Ph.D. in Meat Sciences from the University of Illinois. For over twenty years he has been a professor of Animal Science at Fresno State University. As one of the leading experts on rabbit husbandry, one step into his classroom and his inspirational power as an educator is certain.
